[redacted] indicated on 3/13/57, that FREDERICK WEISS had visited KEITH THOMPSON on 2/22/57, and after this visit, had gone to Elizabeth, New Jersey, to pick up some literature from his printer. He stated the title of this new item is "Apres Nous le Deluge," which was signed by FREDERICUS and HAROLDUS, which stands for WEISS and THOMPSON.

The informant stated that this piece contains seven cartoons which are anti-UN, anti-Jewish and anti-US foreign policy. WEISS reportedly obtained these cartoons from a count in Italy. The informant said WEISS had 5,000 of these sheets printed bearing the name Polzin Publications, Post Office Box 85, Parkesburg, Pennsylvania, as the publisher; however, WEISS, after having these printed, sent them to [redacted] in Parkesburg, Pennsylvania, for distribution. He stated that [redacted] formerly was associated with the National Renaissance Party, and has published nationalist literature in Parkesburg from time to time.

The informant indicated that WEISS had stated he is using [redacted] "to catch flies," and that the people who used to write to him, WEISS, no longer trust him, and, therefore, he must distribute his literature through other channels.

He added that THOMPSON recently stated that an agent of Naval Intelligence had questioned him about EUSTACE MULLINS. THOMPSON said he informed this agent that he had not seen MULLINS in a long time, and had no information concerning his activities.

He advised that he received the previous letter from the subject dated 12/27/56 at his residence, [redacted]. He said it was addressed to an individual named [redacted] first name not recalled. He stated that it came as second class mail, and someone at his residence opened it without realizing it was not addressed to any member of his family. He said that [redacted] is unknown to him, and has never resided at that address. He stated he built the home at that address, and knows all occupants there since it was built. He does not know the true identity of [redacted] although stated occasionally, circulars come to his residence addressed to her, which indicates to him that some mailing list carries her address incorrectly.

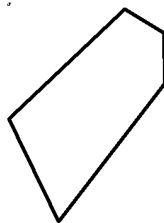

BERKELEY is former registered foreign agent for

He said the subject also listed personal references as DONALD SWAN, 88-42 209th Street, Queens Village, New York, and [REDACTED]

[redacted] added that during the time the subject has resided in this apartment he has had no complaints concerning him, and the subject apparently is a desirable tenant. He added, however, that he had been advised by other tenants of this building that from time to time another man has been living in this apartment with the subject, and he has heard allegations from persons whom he does not recall that the subject is a homosexual. [redacted] was unable to furnish any information regarding any political activity of the subject and did not know any persons who were well acquainted with the subject.

[redacted] indicated on July 9, 1953, that he was well acquainted with DONALD ARTHUR SWAN, 88-42 209th Street, Queens Village. He indicated that SWAN had been expelled from Queens College, Queens, New York, in 1953 because of his alleged anti-semitic, anti-negro, pro-Facisist activities. [redacted] stated that SWAN continues to meet with HAROLD KEITH THOMPSON, JR., and that SWAN still indicates pro Neo-Nazi sympathies. [redacted] stated that SWAN does not engage in any activities that are pro Neo-Nazi, but he believes that SWAN sympathies are still of that nature. [redacted] added that SWAN has never been a member of any organization to his knowledge, and that SWAN does not presently attend any pro Neo-Nazi meetings because of the advice of THOMPSON who instructed SWAN not to join any organization or attend meetings because he, THOMPSON, does not want SWAN observed at such meetings.

DONALD SWAN was interviewed by Agents of the New York Office in September, 1953, and stated he was well acquainted with THOMPSON because they frequently discuss political matters.

SWAN denied that he was a member of any pro Neo-Nazi group, but stated he believed there were many good things about the Nazi system as it existed in Germany under ADOLPH HITLER. SWAN also stated that "inquiries concerning the activities of pro Neo-Nazi groups, by the FBI compared with police state tactics in Communist dominated countries."

According to the report, "Common Sense" depicts Communism as "Judaism" and devotes its pages almost exclusively to attacks on the Jewish and to a lesser extent the negro minorities in our nation. Sympathy for the former Nazi regime in Germany is also injected into this propaganda.

RALPH A. BARD, Assistant Secretary, United States Navy, was treasurer and trustee of the Anti-New Deal "Crusaders" on March 8, 1936. [redacted]

[redacted] testified before the Black Committee that BARD was one of the three members in charge of the organization "Voice of the Air" programs. He was assisted by [redacted] of the [redacted] and [redacted] of [redacted] BARD at that time headed the investment firm of Ralph A. Bard and Company, Chicago, Illinois.

BARD (at that time) was the chairman of the Board of Eversharp, Incorporated, a member of the Board of Directors of Shik Corporation, F. and C. Dridge and Dock Company, Clearing Machine Corporation, Ford Dearborn Mortgage Corporation, and Number 333 Buildings Corporation.

This letter also contained information that during the Black investigation it was disclosed among many things that the Crusaders were in back of the telegram barrage sent to Washington against proposed legislation.

This letter with attached photostat copy was, according to letter of transmittal, strictly confidential and any inquiry made on the basis of the information contained

[redacted] advised that BARD, Sr. is about 72 years of age and was Assistant Secretary of the Navy under Secretary KNOX. He stated that the BARDS have maintained a suite of rooms in the building at 208 South LaSalle Street for approximately 25 years. He advised that BARD, Jr. would be about 40 years of age and is actively associated with his father.

[redacted] advised that he did not know nor had he ever heard of anything of an unfavorable nature concerning either of the BARDS and was under the impression that they did not actively seek anyone else's business.

He advised that RALPH A. BARD, Sr. resides at 531 North St. Johns Avenue, Highland Park, Illinois, and BARD, Jr. resides on Brinker Road, Barrington, Illinois.

[redacted] was unable to furnish any additional pertinent information.

On October 10, 1957, records of the Chicago Police Department, Chicago, Illinois, were reviewed by Investigative Clerk [redacted] and no information that could be associated with either of the BARDS could be located.

It appears from the notes that the CP may be preparing to support CHESTER BOWLES for Senator in the 1956 general elections and it also appears that attempts may be made to have BOWLES take a position on the Flanders Resolution in Congress aimed at censure of Senator MC CARTHY."

NED SPARKS is publicly known as a national functionary of the CP, USA.

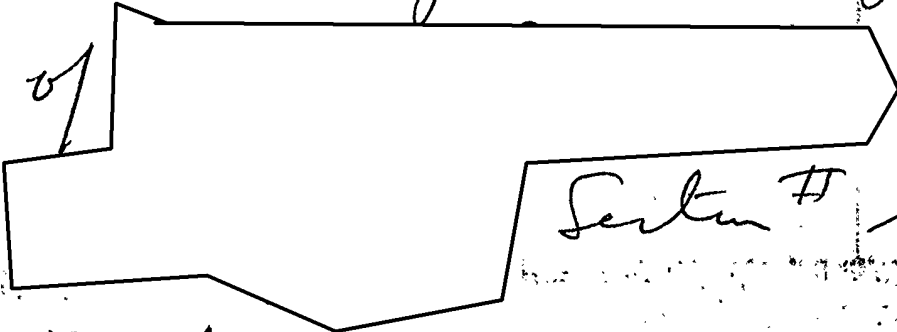

As underscored by the U. S. Navy League's 1957 "Operation Remember" more than twelve years have elapsed since the end of World War II. In order to gain a better historical perspective on the "war crimes trials" of professional military men in the aftermath of World War II, this letter is particularly addressed to you.

In October of 1956, Grand Admiral Karl Doenitz, Commander-in-Chief of the German Navy, was released from an "international" prison, after having served an illegal sentence of ten years confinement awarded at the Nuremberg "war crimes trials". The Admiral's "crime" was the effective professional direction of the wartime navy of his country, a "criminal standard" under which almost any career military or naval officer could be convicted.

Here it should be recalled that the "International Military Tribunal" at Nuremberg had no authorization or precedent in international law; that it was not a "Military Tribunal" in any sense of the term; and that it was based on ex post facto concepts, directly in violation of Anglo-American constitutional principles. Moreover, international law has no punitive provisions and rests entirely upon comity.

Rear Admiral Daniel V. Gallery, U. S. Navy, in his latest book, TWENTY MILLION TONS UNDER THE SEA (Regnery:Chicago), calls the "War Crimes Trials" a "libel on the military profession", and brands the trial of Grand Admiral Karl Doenitz as "barefaced hypocrisy". Further, Admiral Gallery terms the Doenitz conviction "an insult to our own submariners", and points out that U. S. Fleet Admiral Chester Nimitz, testifying in defense of Admiral Doenitz, conceded that U. S. submarines in the Pacific had waged the same "unrestricted warfare" as had the German Navy in the Atlantic.

For more than a year I have been assembling a collection of current opinions on the "war crimes trials" of career officers in general, and the case of Grand Admiral Doenitz in particular. This collection also contains many personal messages of greeting, good wishes and expressions of professional attainment, and will be presented to Admiral Doenitz. Attached hereto is a partial, representative list, indicating some of the many prominent participants.

This collection of opinions will represent a milestone in the historical re-appraisal of the dangerous precedent set at Nuremberg. In order that better perspective may be gained on this question, it is important that your views be recorded. I very much hope that you will wish to cooperate in this way. Any comments which you have to make on "war crimes trials" in general, the Doenitz case in particular, (and on "unrestricted submarine warfare") would be most welcome, and can be addressed either to Admiral Doenitz or to me, and sent to me at the above address.

DOENITZ GOES FREE

Grand Adm. Karl Doenitz, commander of the German navy at the end of World War II, has completed his 10 year sentence as a "war criminal" and has been released from Spandau prison in Berlin. He was sentenced by an international tribunal at Nuernberg, acting under ex post facto "law" invented for the occasion. The penalties prescribed were never legislated by any lawmakers, but by representatives of the victor countries who then took over the prosecution.

The presence of Adm. Doenitz among the defendants presented the victors with an unforeseen embarrassment. He was charged with having conducted unrestricted submarine warfare. The tribunal reluctantly admitted that, in assessing this charge, an order of the British admiralty, dated May 8, 1940, directing that all vessels in the Skagerrak should be sunk without warning, could not be disregarded.

The tribunal was also obliged to take cognizance of the undisputed fact that the United States, from the first day of the war, had also waged unrestricted submarine warfare.

The laws governing submarine warfare were clearly and precisely defined in the London naval treaty of 1930,

which specified that attacks were to be confined to unmistakable vessels of war, and then only after seeing to the safety of all hands. The American navy, in its official report on the submarine campaign against Japan, admitted an indiscriminate campaign in which nine out of every 10 Japanese ships sunk were non-combatant vessels. Of 276,000 Japanese drowned in these attacks, 105,000 were civilians.

Under the circumstances, the Nuernberg tribunal was in no position to work up a production against Adm. Doenitz on the same grounds. Its decision that its judgment must weigh similar acts on the part of the allies established a novel principle in jurisprudence—i. e., that whether a particular act was or was not a crime depended on whether the prosecution also had committed it. If the victors had committed it, it could not be a crime.

Nevertheless, the blanket charges against the defendants of planning, preparing, initiating, or conducting aggressive war were sufficiently broad to produce a finding that Adm. Doenitz was guilty of something—probably the crime of fighting, as a professional officer, in the service of his country. He got 10 years—a verdict proving once again that might makes right, and that hypocrisy can surmount all obstacles.

On 8/22/58 SA [redacted] was telephonically contacted by an individual who identified himself only that he was calling from the office of General JOHN M. WILLIS, U. S. Army (RET), Director of the Hamod Hospital, Erie, Pa. The caller stated that he wished to advise that a letter received by General WILLIS from an H. KEITH THOMPSON, Box 254, Wall Street Station, New York 5, New York, would be mailed to the Erie Office of the FBI for information; that General WILLIS did not respond to the request set forth in the letter from THOMPSON; and that General WILLIS desired to give the letter to the FBI because he was suspicious of the purpose of the letter. The caller advised that the General could not furnish any further information on this matter; that there would be no point in contacting the General personally; and that the General wanted nothing further to do with this matter.

On 8/22/58 the above mentioned letter from H. KEITH THOMPSON to General WILLIS was received at the Erie RA along with three enclosures.

One enclosure set forth THOMPSON's efforts to assemble a collection of current opinions on the "war crimes trials" in general and on the case of Grand Admiral KARL DOENITZ, Commander-in-Chief of the Germany Navy, in particular.

Another enclosure was a two-page list of prominent individuals who contributed their opinion on these matters at the request of THOMPSON.

The third enclosure was a copy of an article from the "Chicago Daily Tribune," part one, page 16, dated 10/6/56, on the release of Admiral DOENITZ from prison.

The original communications as furnished by General WILLIS are enclosed for the information of New York. Indices of Pittsburgh Office contain no information concerning H. KEITH THOMPSON. No further action is being taken by the Pittsburgh Office in this matter.

Reference is made to your memorandum of May 14, 1958, in which you request to be advised whether the subject's activities require his registration pursuant to the provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended.

As mentioned in our memorandum of November 21, 1956, the statement on subject's letterhead to the effect that he was a correspondent for an Argentine newspaper constituted him an agent of a foreign principal as defined by Section 1(c) of the Act. However, pursuant to Rule 303 of the Rules and Regulations promulgated under the Act, representatives of newspapers are regarded as exempt under the provisions of Section 3(d) of the Act so long as their political activity is confined to that set forth in Rule 303.

Since the information submitted is insufficient to establish that the matter disseminated by the subject constituted political activity as that term is defined by Rule 100(a)(11) of the Rules and Regulations, it is the opinion of this Division that the exemption provided representatives of newspapers by Section 3(d) of the Act is available to the subject and therefore will not be solicited at this time.

On October 13, 1958, BURT WILLIAM ERICKSON NELSON, born February 4, 1928, Jersey City, New Jersey, a graduate of the University of Minnesota in 1952, who is now employed as City Editor of the Willoughby News Herald, Willoughby, Ohio, a daily newspaper owned and published by OLIVER BOLTON, former Ohio Congressman, furnished the following information to SA [redacted]. He advised that while a student at Columbia University for three years prior to 1951, he became acquainted with EDWARD FLECKENSTEIN, who is an attorney and who presently resides at 39 King Street, Newark, New Jersey.

Through his association with FLECKENSTEIN, he became aware of the existence of organized anti-Semitic groups, and met through FLECKENSTEIN several of the leading exponents of anti-Semitism.

As a result of the recent bombing of a Jewish synagogue in Atlanta, Mr. NELSON believed it advisable to furnish the FBI with the names of the anti-Semitic individuals who have come to his attention:
